Great Ukulele Chord Progressions

In this study, we'll use chord voicings known as "shell" voicings. The most important notes in a 7th chord are the 3 rd and the 7 th intervals as measured from the root note of the chord. These are known as the guide tones. A shell voicing is made up of these guide tones plus the root.
